OBJECTIVES

1. Describe the importance of a team approach to implementing and customizing the workflow of an EHR, recognize the value of efficient and safe electronic record keeping in a modern ophthalmic practice, identify and avoid common pitfalls with conversion to an EHR including those that potentially degrade the workplace environment.
2. Define vitreomacular adhesion, describe the treatment options for vitreomacular adhesion, recognize the advantages and disadvantages of the various treatment options for vitreomacular adhesion.
3. Identify the information to be gained from OCT imaging, compare and contrast various imaging modalities, describe basic scanning protocols and methods.
4. Recognize appropriate candidates for collagen cross-linking, identify the treatment objectives of collagen cross-linking therapy in patients with keratoconus and post-LASIK ectasia, discuss the biochemistry of collagen cross-linking.
5. Compare and contrast various techniques available for cataract removal., identify appropriate indications for femtosecond laser assisted cataract surgery, describe the local availability of femtosecond laser technology within the context of national scientific status and availability.
6. Identify the indications for antiVEGF therapy, compare and contrast different antiVEGF treatment strategies, discuss the pharmacodynamics of increased dose antiVEGF therapy, recognize the safety implications of antiVEGF therapy.
